

## Dear Padre 🛶 May 16, 2021



My neighbor, a fundamentalist Christian, said I won't be saved unless I accept Jesus as my personal savior. Didn't Jesus become my savior when I was baptized?

**Your** neighbor is probably referring to John 3:7, when Jesus said, "You must be born anew" (Common English Bible). Jesus is talking about a spiritual rebirth; we must have a spiritual birth in order to be saved. As you noted, Catholics believe this happens at baptism. In John 3:5, Jesus says, "Unless someone is born of water and the Spirit, it's not possible to enter God's kingdom."

We are saved by the waters of baptism. But for Catholics, it's not merely a onetime event. We continue to accept or reject the salvation offered us by the decisions we make every day.

**Your** neighbor used the words "personal savior." Catholic Christians go even deeper through the sacraments. We develop and nurture a very personal relationship with Jesus by regularly receiving the Eucharist. In the sacrament of reconciliation, we admit we have sinned and ask Jesus to forgive us. And in the sacrament of confirmation, our relationship is "sealed" with the gift of the Spirit.

**Many** Catholics also celebrate the sacrament of marriage. The couple's personal relationship with Jesus is deepened through the love the couple shares.

**So**, tell your neighbor you are indeed saved by Jesus. And because you are saved, you deepen that relationship with Jesus by living a sacramental life.

#### **REFLECTION FOR PARENTS:**


There is an old expression, "preaching to the choir." It is easy to preach to the choir because those in the choir already believe in the Good News of Jesus Christ. The challenge for every disciple is to carry the Good News to all people—even to, and especially to, those who are not a part of the choir. Pope Francis suggested one small way to do this when he stated in *The Joy of the Gospel* that the greatest evangelizer is a joyful Christian. Take time to think about his words today. Are you a joyful Christian? Do people see the gift of joy evident in your life? Do they hear it in your words? Pray for an increase in the gift of joy that others—including those in your own family—may be drawn to Christ through you.

#### **BRINGING THE GOSPEL INTO YOUR FAMILY:**

Share Pope Francis' words with your family. Invite each family member to share how he or she sees joy alive in your family and in the world today.

Brainstorm ways your family can share the joy of the Good News with others, and make an action plan to do so at least once in the coming week.






#### **DISCUSSION STARTERS:**




**Being Authentic Stewards**: This Sunday we celebrate the great solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Before Jesus ascended nto heaven he told his apostles, and us as well, to "go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation." To spread the Gospel is an essential aspect of our stewardship. The greatest gift we possess is the knowledge and experience of Christ's love and mercy and we should seek to share this with as many people as possible.


In order to spread the Gospel, we must overcome the temptation of having a split personality or a double life. We shouldn't hang up our faith on the door as if it were a jacket we took off when we walked into the office. Our faith should instead be woven into every aspect of our lives. To always live as a disciple of Christ and showcase the joy of being a Catholic is perhaps the greatest good we can do in evangelizing our neighbour.

St. Charles Borromeo says, "Be sure that you first preach by the way you live. If you do not, people will notice that you say one thing, but live otherwise, and your words will bring only cynical laughter and a derisive shake of the head." If people know we are practicing Catholics, we can . potentially scandalize them if we act uncharitably or contrary to the faith. Therefore, let us strive to make our entire lives a reflection of God so that we may constantly spread the Gospel.

**Summary:** Before His ascension, Jesus tells His apostles, and us, to go into the world and spread the Gospel. To be authentic stewards we can't hang up our faith on the door as if it were a jacket we took off when we walked into the office. # ST. LAWRENCE MARTYR CHURCH May 16, 2021 – The Ascension of The Lord



QUESTION: "What is the meaning and importance of the ascension of Jesus Christ?"

ANSWER: After Jesus rose from the dead, He "presented Himself alive "to the women near the tomb, to His disciples, and to more than 500 others. In the days following His resurrection, Jesus taught His disciples about the kingdom of God. Forty days after the resurrection, Jesus and His disciples went to Mount Olivet, near Jerusalem. There, Jesus promised His followers that they


would soon receive the Holy Spirit, and He instructed them to remain in Jerusalem until the Spirit had come. Then Jesus blessed them, and as He gave the blessing, He began to ascend into heaven. It is plain from Scripture that Jesus' ascension was a literal, bodily return to heaven. He rose from the ground gradually and visibly, observed by many intent onlookers. As the disciples strained to catch a last glimpse of Jesus, a cloud hid Him from their view, and two angels appeared and promised Christ's return "in just the same way that you have watched Him go". The Ascension of Jesus Christ is meaningful for several reasons: 1) It signaled the end of His earthly ministry. God the Father had lovingly sent His Son into the world at Bethlehem, and now the Son was returning to the Father. The period of human limitation was at an end. 2) It signified success in His earthly work. All that He had come to do, He had accomplished. 3) It marked the return of His heavenly glory. Jesus' glory had been veiled during His sojourn on earth, with one brief exception at the Transfiguration. 4) It symbolized His exaltation by the Father. The One with whom the Father is well pleased was received up in honor and given a name above all names. 5) It allowed Him to prepare a place for us. 6) It indicated the beginning of His new work as High Priest and Mediator of the New Covenant. 7) It set the pattern for His return. When Jesus comes to set up the Kingdom, He will return just as He left-literally, bodily, and visibly in the clouds. Currently, the Lord Jesus is in heaven. The Scriptures frequently picture Him at the right hand of the Father-a position of honor and authority. Christ is the Head of the Church, the giver of spiritual gifts, and the One who fills all in all.

#### OFFERING A MASS IS A MEANINGFUL PART OF OUR CATHOLIC TRADITION:

The Mass book for 2022 will be available on November 1, 2021. Please note the following changes in requesting a Mass. The following guidelines are meant to make the process of requesting an intention easy and fair to all parishioners. Here are the guidelines:

- You may submit your Mass requests by email or drop it off in person to the parish office.
- We will accept up to 5 Masses per registered household. Of those, one may be for a Sunday Mass (including Saturday anticipated), and four for weekday Masses, and in the case of Latin Masses 5 weekday Masses since there are no Mass intentions permitted for Sunday Mases.
- A \$20 stipend, as determined by archdiocesan policy, is requested for each Mass intention.
- On April 1st 2022, parishioners may book 5 additional Masses per registered household for a total of 10 Masses per calendar year.





#### **ACT OF CONTRITION TO THE SACRED HEART:**

Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen




#### **ELEMENTARY REGISTRATION FOR SEPTEMBER 2021:**
