Matthew 22:1-14

Invite everyone you can to the Wedding

A wedding is a time of joy and completion after long preparation, a time of love and of complete satisfaction. In Judaism at the time of Jesus the coming of the Messiah is often compared to a wedding-feast. The marriage-feast at Cana must have been some party! At

Mary's request Jesus produced 200 gallons of wine. The Letter to the Ephesians teaches that the love in a human wedding is only a pale shadow of Christ's love for his bride, the Church. In this story of the royal wedding, however, two things go drastically wrong. First, the original wedding-guests refuse to come. Not only do they refuse, but they brutally maltreat the innocent messengers, and the king (who must stand for God) relentlessly burns down their city. This must be an adjustment to Jesus' story, applying it to the Sack of Jerusalem, captured and burnt by the Romans in 70AD, a few years before Matthew was writing. Secondly, the man who has no wedding-garment is slung out. A wedding-garment is a standard Jewish image for works of generosity expected of every faithful Jew. For us Christians, too, the story constitutes a double warning.

Alcuni tra coloro che trasmettono questo invito alle nozze saranno forse maltrattati, forse uccisi. Ci saranno certamente quelli che rifiutano l'invito. Poco importa. C'è gente agli angoli delle strade. Basta annunciare con convinzione che noi andiamo a un banchetto, che l'invito di Cristo è arrivato fino a noi e che noi conosciamo le portate. Basta sapere che noi possiamo tutto in colui che ci conforta.

L'annunciamo così? Siamo convincenti perché abbiamo già partecipato a questo banchetto? Non c'è niente di più ripugnante di coloro le cui parole ripetono quello che dicono gli altri, senza dare prova di alcuna esperienza.

28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – OCTOBER 15TH, 2023

Pastor's

Dear Friends in Christ, last Sunday at the 11:30 am Mass, our Archbishop, His Grace, The Most Reverend Francis Leo, came to our parish to celebrate The Rite of Ordination to the Diaconate of Daniel Lee. The crisp Autumn morning gifted us with a refreshing breeze that cooled the entire church, which was filled to capacity by people from all walks and states of life. In attendance were many of Daniel's family and friends, priests, deacons, seminarians, religious, and lay faithful from throughout the Archdiocese. The celebration was a wonderful, grace-filled event for all who witnessed it.

Before being ordained to the diaconate, Daniel had to declare before the people of God his intention to undertake the office: to be ordained for the Church's ministry; to discharge the office of deacon with humility and love in order to assist the bishop and the priests and to serve the people of Christ; to hold fast to the mystery of faith with a clear conscience, and to proclaim it in word and action as it is taught by the Gospel and the Church's tradition; to live a celibate life as a sign of dedication of his life to Christ the Lord; and to guard and increase the spirit of prayer proper to his way of life, and to celebrate faithfully the Liturgy of the Hours for the Church and the whole world; and resolve to conform his manner of life to the example of Christ. Moreover, Daniel had to make a promise of respect and obedience to the Archbishop and his successor (cf. Rite of Ordination to the Diaconate).

After making these promises, and following the invitation to prayer and the invocation of the heavenly saints, Daniel experienced the essential elements of the ordination - the laying on of hands and the prayer of ordination. "In the ancient tradition of the Church, the sacrament of Holy Orders is conferred by the laying on of hands, followed by a solemn prayer of consecration asking God to grant the elect the graces of the Holy Spirit required for service in the Church" (cf. Rite of Ordination to the Diaconate). And with the completion of these simple actions, Daniel was ordained to serve in the Church.

In his closing remarks, Daniel shared with us the powerful words, which he received from a nun he knew. She told him: "Rivers do not drink their own water; trees do not eat their own fruit; the sun does not shine on itself and flowers do not spread their fragrance for themselves. We are all born to help each other. No matter how difficult it is.... Life is good when you are happy, but much better when others are happy because of you" [Author's note: the origin of these words have been disputed with some attributing it to Pope Francis, while others arguing that it originates from an ancient Sanskrit proverb. What the wise nun intended to underline for Daniel was the importance of his call to a life of service. His ordination to the diaconate (and future ordination to the priesthood) is first-and-foremost a call to serve the people of God in the Church. Should Daniel live his life with this fundamental call in mind, he would undoubtedly be following in the footsteps of Our Lord, who told His apostles that "just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many" (Mt. 20:28).

As Daniel begins his life of service, let us keep him, and the other seminarians who have been ordained to the diaconate, in our prayers. Let us be seech the Lord to abundantly bless each of them with a spirit of generosity so that they can lovingly and wholeheartedly serve all who will be entrusted to their spiritual care.



prayer-group leader encouraging us to write our own prayers for our meetings. Don't you need some formal religious training to write prayers? Will our prayers count?

It's given to every human being to be able to pray. On the level of the spiritual life, prayer is as basic as breathing is to physical life. Everyone at every moment has the grace to say a prayer.

Sometimes I ask people, "Do you pray?" At times they tell me they don't. Then I ask them, "Well, do you talk with God?" And most answer, "Of course." That's praying.

When writing your prayers, I suggest you use this ancient definition as inspiration: Prayer is the raising of the mind and heart to God. I'm sure your prayers will be that in word and feeling, and they will count.

When writing more formal prayers, it's nice to include the prayer elements the Church considers important: adoration of God, contrition and sorrow for sin, thanksgiving for life and for God's care of us in good times and bad, and petition for what we desperately need in our poverty. And for you, a final word. Remember that no matter how bad things may get, no matter how out of control things feel, you always have the gift and power of saying a prayer. Especially in time of temptation-when things really go bad-ask Mary your Mother to pray with you. •
