4TH SUNDAY OF EASTER - APRIL 21, 2024

John 10:11-18



"The Good Shepherd is One who lays down His Life for His sheep..."

Each year on this Sunday there is a reading from John about the Good Shepherd. To think of ourselves as woolly and cuddly sheep, obedient to the shepherd, would be a mistake. Sheep are renowned as being silly, contradictory creatures, always starting off in the wrong direction, getting themselves into tangles and difficulties. In the Holy Land they are scraggy beasts, pastured on rocky and often dangerous ground, amid boulders and

rocky cliffs, threatened by wild animals and marauders. It was not simply a matter of the shepherd sitting on a rock and idly playing his pipe. He needed to be on the alert to save the sheep from hurting themselves. So Jesus as the good shepherd is kept well occupied by our foibles, our stubbornness, our mistakes and our fears. Again, as in the other two readings, there is the reassurance of a close relationship with the Father. Jesus knows us intimately, just as he knows the Father. It is questionable whether in real life a shepherd should lay down his life for his sheep: what would happen to the remainder of the flock? But it is an expression of his whole-hearted devotion to the sheep, and an assimilation to the case of Jesus.

E da che cosa si vede se sono tue? Che dai la vita per loro. Gesù dà la vita per noi. È lui che ce la dà, tiene a precisare, nessuno gliela toglie. Lui, solo lui, ha il potere di offrire la sua vita e di riprenderla di nuovo. In questo sta la sua autorevolezza, nel potere dell'impotenza, a cui Dio nella morte si è volontariamente esposto.

Gli uomini possono seguire Gesù solo in forza di questa sua autorevolezza. Per essa ne conoscono la voce, subiscono il fascino della sua Presenza, si dispongono alla sequela. Solo nel vivere questa appartenenza il cristiano diventa a sua volta autorevole, cioè capace di incontrare l'altro, di amarlo e di dar la sua vita per lui. L'appartenenza fa essere eco fragile e tenace della sua Presenza e suscita la nostalgia di poterlo incontrare.

4TH SUNDAY OF EASTER - APRIL 21, 2024

Dear Friends in Christ, for the past two Corners I have offered for your reflection the faith journey experiences of two young women, Wendy and Zoe (also best of friends), who recently converted to the Catholic Church. This weekend I would like to present a final reflection, which comes from Robert Henderson, husband to Kimberly, and a father to three children.

Robert wrote: "My wife started to attend Mass at St. Lawrence and I offered to drive her there. I decided on a whim to attend the first time she went. I come from a non-religious family and married a Catholic, but I have always believed in God. I knew what to expect during Mass having attended occasionally with our children who attended the TDCSB and were raised in the faith. We attended for several weeks and I started to feel comfortable being there. After awhile as I was listening to the homilies, I found that I agreed with the messages of morality. There were many drives home where my wife and I would wonder if Father was talking about our lives. Listening to the readings I began to understand what the Faith was about.

There was not one thing that brought me to accept Christ. Some of the reasons are: The importance of forgiveness. Christ said 'If you forgive others their transgressions, your Heavenly Father will forgive you.' I have had people in my life who have been harmful. Forgiving them has been hard, but it has also been liberating. It has been like putting down a heavy stone you did not know you were carrying.

Being at Mass and listening to Christ's message has given me cause for introspection with regard to how I have treated others in the past. I have carried remorse for years, but looking back I see now that youth and ignorance played a large part in my actions. Oddly some of things that would regularly pop into my head that I felt guilty about I now have difficulty remembering.

Father Thomas has been very influential in my journey to Christ. His dedication and obvious joy that he brings to his ministry is infectious. His homilies have frequently struck a nerve and I have been moved to tears several times. It was a pleasure to attend the RCIA with him." Pax Christi, 7r. 7homas

My son was raised Catholic and still claims he is Catholic, but he and his wife go to a Protestant church. How should I deal with my frustration?


Many parents and grandparents today share your frustration. They raised their children Catholic, maybe even sent them to Catholic schools, but the children have grown up and chosen not to continue to be faithful Catholics. A recent survey showed that nine out of ten people say they believe in God, but often they are not committed to a single religion or house of worship. About half of the people questioned attend religious services less than once a month, or never. The loyalty to one Church that was evident in our own lives, or in our parents' and grandparents' lives, is lacking in today's people under age fifty-five.

What can one do about this situation? Certainly pray for your children and continue to give a good example through your own loyalty to the Catholic Church and attendance at Sunday Mass. Invite your son and his wife to attend with you when they visit. As your children age, they may become more interested in your family's history and traditions, and the religion of their childhood may again appear attractive. Try to be patient and continue to pray that your children will return to the Church of their roots. •


