PENTECOST SUNDAY ~ JUNE 8, 2025

John 14.15-16.23-26

The Holy Spirit will teach you everything.



In Jesus' final speech to his disciples after the Last Supper, preparing them for life after the Resurrection, he several times mentions a mysterious figure, the Paraclete. 'Paraclete' is Greek for 'advocate', someone called to your side to help, to guide you through a tricky patch. In Hebrew mythology about the Last Judgement there would be an Accuser and an Advocate on either side. Jesus will send — or in other passages the Father will send — this Advocate to his followers as his own presence when he is

no longer there, to guide the Church into all truth. That is the inspiring situation: the Church and each of its individuals will continue to deepen our understanding of the mysteries of God, over the centuries and over the years of our life. Before the Spirit was given, even the disciples who had been with Jesus throughout his ministry failed to understand his real significance, and certainly lacked courage to proclaim it. The coming of the Paraclete was the booster-rocket which set off the Church on its course and keeps it on course. Now it is the duty and privilege of each of the members of the Church to fulfil the prophetic office of the Church, understanding more deeply and declaring more clearly the truth about Christ in the world.

Dio ha conferito al suo popolo una grande autorità stabilendo che la salvezza fosse concessa agli uomini per mezzo della Chiesa!

Ma questa autorità, per essere conforme al senso della Pentecoste, deve sempre essere esercitata con misericordiae con gioia, che sono le caratteristiche di Cristo, che ha sofferto ed è risorto, e che esulta eternamente nello Spirito Santo.



PENTECOST SUNDAY ~ JUNE 8, 2025

Dear Friends in Christ, today we celebrate the great solemnity of Pentecost, the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon Mary and the apostles and filled them with his incredible gifts and blessings. What happened that day continues to take

place whenever the Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated for one of the faithful. Today, permit me to offer you the story of Dominic Sim, who wrote "A Brief Reflection of My Journey in Faith" and received the Sacrament of Confirmation this past Easter Vigil. This is his story....

"Luckily for me, I was born a Catholic. I went to a Catholic school as a kid and I used to hold my faith like a badge of honour, feeling like I knew a lot about Christ and His teachings. But oh, how wrong was I. As I grew older, I was shaped and affected by events in my life, which drew me away from God. Whereas before I was proud to uphold my faith to even a stranger, I had gotten to a point where I was scared to mention it to my dearest friends. Why? Social media made an impressionable teen like me believe my faith made me a bigot and a lunatic, so I became scared of sharing my beliefs, especially since I knew that I had lived a sinful life and felt unworthy of proclaiming the goodness of the Lord.

Therefore, without God as my backdrop, with traumatic events occurring and my continual life in sin, I fell into despair. Anxiety afflicted me and I felt no one in the world had any love or value for me as a person. With more and more bad days after the other, I started to lose hope. But deep inside, I knew my despair came from a feeling of unworthiness and guilt towards God. For if no one, not even God loved me, who am I to exist in this world? So I decided to make a change and planned to start going to church regularly, but I couldn't even get past waking up in the morning to go to church. So for weeks and months, I failed over and over again, making me feel even worse than I had before. My anxiety only became worse, I could not sleep at night and I had trouble even conversing with a single stranger. Hate and fear overwhelmed me. I felt my purpose in life was unclear and I was a complete failure and loser.

Then out of nowhere, I felt love from God. I do not exactly know how to explain it, but I felt a love that overwhelmed me like never before. For the first time in a long time, I felt I mattered. I did not hear any words, but I just knew it was from God, and my emotions overwhelmed me and I cried for the first time in so long from the love I felt. To me, my Creator and the King of the Universe telling me I am perfect just the way I am was unbelievable. Just a few days earlier, I thought my life was utterly useless and that I would be dealing with mental illness for the rest of my life, but God showed me a different path. His love came to me and made me feel like I deserved to exist, to be loved and to love others.

From that moment on, I swore to myself I had to owe it up to God. He saved me. I was at my absolute lowest, but only One came to save me. No one else helped me. I decided to start praying everyday, going to church every week, and reading the Bible everyday. I wanted to show and prove to God my appreciation for His grace. I started loving other people better and loving myself too, trying to live the life Jesus commands of us. I tried, yet still have trouble battling sin and temptation, but God's grace has only kept growing. That is why when I learned about RCIA in church, I thought it was the logical next step, to get confirmed in the faith and to get closer with God. I do not know where my plans lie next, but all I know is that God is with me every step of the way, whether I take one-step forward or misstep and fall down. He will always be there for me and love me.

That is why I write this reflection, because I am no longer scared of hiding my faith in God. He saved me and He will save everyone else! 'For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish, but have everlasting life' (Jn. 3:16). Thanks be to God." Pax Christi. 7r. 7homas

Dear Padre,

My Catholic friend says she speaks in tongues and does not feel she needs an interpretation as she does so. She writes down the exchange as she listens to others. What does the Catholic Church say about speaking in tongues? How should I respond if she asks to pray for me in this way?

Good for your friend. A robust spiritual practice is a real grace from God. At the same time, it seems that a gentle reminder,



albeit a respectful one, to your friend might include the wisdom of St. Paul. In 1 Corinthians, Paul cautions that the person who speaks in tongues must ask for interpretation of what is spoken so that it may be confirmed. There is real wisdom offered here. It is also helpful to remember that in the Christian understanding of supernatural gifts, such gifts are not intended solely for the individual person but always for the well-being of the community and the common good (1 Cor 12:7). Keeping this integrated and balanced understanding as an essential component of the manifestation of the charismatic gifts of the Holy Spirit will only lead to good and to a more powerful experience of God's grace and life. In the Christian life, it is never about just the individual, but always inclusive of the experience of our brothers and sisters in Christ. •


