SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY ~ JUNE 15, 2025

John 16.12-15



Everything that the Father has is Mine; the Spirit will take from what is Mine and declare it to you.

Since every human era and generation has a slightly different mentality and way of thinking, differing dominant skills (the present generation dominated by social media) it will use different questions and different terminology. The guidance of the Paraclete will be necessary to translate or formulate the truth in ways which are intelligible, relevant and gripping to each new generation. Sometimes these will be expressed and

forwarded by charismatic personalities who stand out from the accepted norms of society and yet are revered as transcending those norms (a Mother Teresa or a Nelson Mandela). At other times the truth will be forwarded by the established hierarchy of the Church. It may even be that some members of the hierarchy are seen also as charismatic leaders (Oscar Romero, Pope John Paul II, Pope Francis). At all times the Paraclete would be needed to guide Christian thinkers with regard to new philosophical insights and insights into human nature, such as Augustine, Aquinas, John Fisher, John Henry Newman.

An important element in this would always be the understanding of Christ himself, for instance in the concepts of personality and nature, in the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, in the part played by Christ in the salvation of all people. In all these the revelation and guidance of the Paraclete would 'glorify me'.

Egli, oltre a perdonare i peccati e a riconciliare l'uomo con sé, lo chiama ad una comunione piena di vita ("In quel giorno voi saprete che io sono nel Padre e voi in me ed io in voi": Gv 14,20); gli rivela la ricchezza dei suoi doni e della speranza della gloria futura (Ef 1,17-20); li chiama ad una vita di santità e di donazione nell'amore al prossimo ("Questo è il mio comandamento: che vi amiate gli uni gli altri come io vi ho amati": Gv 15,12). Anch'essi sull'esempio del loro maestro sono chiamati a dare la vita per i fratelli ("Nessuno ha un amore più grande di questo: dare la vita per i propri amici": Gv 15,13). Per ora essi sono incapaci di accogliere e accettare tali realtà. Lo Spirito Santo farà entrare nel cuore degli apostoli l'amore di Cristo crocifisso e risuscitato per loro, li consacrerà a lui in una vita di santità e d'amore, li voterà alla salvezza delle anime. Non saranno più essi a vivere, ma Gesù in loro (cf. Gal 2,20). Ogni cristiano nel corso del suo cammino è chiamato ad arrendersi all'amore e allo Spirito di Cristo crocifisso e risorto. Oggi è il giorno della decisione.

### SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY ~ JUNE 15, 2025

Bulletin.

Dear Friends in Christ, for the past few weeks, I have offered you the reflections of adults who have recently been received or fully initiated into our Catholic Church. Today, I would like to offer you one final story, which comes from Fahad Sheikh, the brother of Roksana Sheikh, whose own faith story is in the 3rd Sunday of Easter's

In reading Fahad's reflection, one cannot help but come away with a sense of amazement on how he has come to profoundly understand and grasp his newfound faith. The way he expressed the different dogmas and teachings of the Church is incredible to say the least. Moreover, there is no doubt that Fahad prayerfully thought about his journey of faith and permitted the Spirit of God to inspire his writing, something that will become obvious when you read it yourself. Given that it took Fahad more than three days to write his reflection, which exceeded more than sixteen hundred words in total, I wish to present it in its entirety. The first part will be in this weekend's Corner, while the conclusion of his reflection will come next weekend. Without further delay, this is Fahad's story....

My Journey to Faith-A Transformative Path to Christianity: "I was born and raised in a devout Muslim family in Bangladesh, where Islam was deeply ingrained in every aspect of my life. From a young age, I was taught to follow Islamic teachings strictly, to pray five times a day, and to uphold the traditions of my faith. My elder brother and I were particularly passionate about Islam, and we even engaged in dawah (Islamic preaching). We followed scholars like Zakir Naik and often debated with others in an attempt to bring them into the fold of Islam.

However, as we grew older, we began to question the foundations of my religion. My brother and I started studying various religious scriptures, including the Ouran, Hadiths, and other texts, to deepen our understanding. During this process, I began noticing inconsistencies in Islamic teachings. I saw contradictions in the Hadiths, discrepancies between the Quran and historical events, and surprising similarities between Islam and Christianity. These observations made me realize that Islam seemed to borrow heavily from Christianity, albeit reshaped to serve the personal, political, and military interests of its founder, Prophet Muhammad....

As I reflected on these disparities, it became clear to me that Islam had manipulated biblical teachings as expansion just for Muhammad's own personal benefit and later continued by his successors, and I could no longer believe in it. My heart and soul were drawn to Christ, who had sacrificed Himself for humanity. Jesus was divine, embodying both the fullness of humanity and the fullness of God. Jesus is not just a prophet or a teacher, but God Himself who took on human form to walk among us. His divinity is seen in His miracles, His teachings, and ultimately in His resurrection from the dead. He is eternal, without beginning or end, and His sacrifice on the Cross was the ultimate act of love to offer salvation to all who believe in Him.

In my search for the right church, I came across the Protestant and Catholic traditions, which are the largest branches of Christianity. I learned that Protestantism originated from a division within the Catholic Church, but it was the Catholic Church that had been established closest to the time of Jesus. I decided to explore the Catholic faith further and met with Father Thomas, a priest who would later become a guiding figure in my spiritual journey.

Father Thomas' words resonated deeply with me. He said, "Forget everything you know and learned, give me an empty brain, and I'll nourish it with the knowledge of faith." This humble invitation to learn with an open heart marked the beginning of my enrollment in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) program, alongside my family." # Dear Padre,

What does the Church teach about respect for the body after death? Is burial the most respectful? It's certainly the most expensive. What about donating your body to science? Or cremation? If someone is cremated, can the ashes be kept respectfully by a family member, or do they have to be buried?

Your question serves as a summation of current practice and exposes the real-life dilemma and choices facing loved ones: "How can I be respectful and at the same time practical?"

Catholics believe that the body of the deceased must be respected and not simply disposed of without care or concern. Current practice allows for burial, cremation, and the donation of the body to science, and choices depend in large part on tradition, culture, and economic circumstances. If someone chooses to donate to medical science, it is with the understanding that the body will be cremated or properly buried. If cremation is the chosen option, proper burial of the cremains in a sacred place is required.

All of this assumes an uneventful passing of the deceased person. It does not account for war, disease, or disaster. When faced with ordinary, rather than extraordinary, circumstances, loved ones have a real opportunity to be grateful and thankful for the chance to mourn, grieve, and show respect for the person. Unfortunately, that is not always the case in today's world.
