SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES ~ JUNE 29, 2025

You are Peter, and I will give you the keys to the Matthew 16:13-19 Kingdom of Heaven.



This gospel reading is a turning-point in the Gospel. Three times the disciples have been chided for their failure to understand who Jesus is, and now, with an almost perceptible flash of inspiration, Peter replies to the question with a full confession, not merely as in Mark that Jesus is the Messiah, but that he is son of the living God. Jesus replies by giving him a new name and explaining its meaning. The Aramaic name, Kephas, which Paul still uses (in Galatians 1-

2), means 'Rock', which enables Jesus to play on the word for the foundation-stone of 'his assembly'. Is Jesus putting 'his assembly', his ekklesia, in parallel with the assembly of God which was Israel as the People of God in the Old Testament, and saying that his assembly is the new People of God?

To Peter Jesus also gives the power to bind and loose, by the conjunction of opposites implying to the Semitic mind that he is giving all power. So much is widely recognised in all catholic teaching. But it is important to recognise that the same promise is made to the community itself in Matthew 18.18, the community discourse, giving it the same authority to bind and loose. To Peter, then, is given the power in the person of the Church.

What is the origin of these promises, which occur only in Matthew's account of the scene, not in those of Mark and Luke? The same sort of promise is made at the Last Supper in Luke 22.32 and emphatically at the Lake of Galilee in John 21.15-17. Its authenticity in Matthew is increased by the density of Aramaic language from 'Bar Jona' in verse 17 onwards, by the punning on the name, and by the Semitic parallelism. It must originate in Aramaic circles.

Oggi siamo in festa nella memoria dei santi apostoli Pietro e Paolo, diversi tra loro, ma celebrati insieme quali colonne della Chiesa di Cristo. Nel Vangelo risuona la domanda cruciale di Gesù: «Voi chi dite che io sia?». Rivolta ai Dodici, tra cui Pietro, ma certamente risuonata a più riprese anche nel cuore di Paolo. Pietro risponde: «Tu sei il Cristo, il Messia, il Figlio di Dio», e Gesù ribatte che questa rivelazione può venire solo dal Padre.

Potremmo elencare anche numerose risposte di Paolo. Entrambi hanno risposto a parole, hanno aderito a Cristo, ma sappiamo come questa fede non li abbia risparmiati da cadute ed errori. Dove sta dunque la loro grandezza? Perché gioiamo per questi apostoli che con il loro sangue hanno dato un fondamento alla Chiesa di Roma che presiede nella carità? Perché il nostro cuore esulta nel contemplare l'abbraccio con cui l'iconografia li ritrae? Perché entrambi hanno saputo dare alla domanda di Gesù una risposta convergente e decisiva, che esprime la verità profonda della Chiesa. Scrive Pietro: «Stringetevi a Cristo, pietra viva, rifiutata dagli uomini ma scelta e preziosa davanti a Dio» (1Pietro 2,4); e Paolo gli fa eco: «I nostri padri bevevano da una roccia... e quella roccia era il Cristo» (1Corinzi 10,4).

Cristo è la pietra angolare, la roccia su cui si fonda la Chiesa indivisa. E solo su questa roccia si può fondare un'intera vita, fino a dire, al momento del congedo: «Ho combattuto la buona battaglia, ho terminato la corsa, ho conservato la fede» (2Timoteo 4,7).

Pastor's Corner

Dear Friends in Christ, please note that this weekend's parish bulletin and Pastor's Corner will be the last one until our parish programs fully resume later in September of this year. As I write these final few words, it is hard to believe how quickly time has flown since my arrival at the parish three years ago in

late June 2022. With the arrival of July, I will start my fourth year as your Pastor... That is correct, my fourth year!

This third year of ministry at SLM has been nothing short of amazing. The Lord, who is kind and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in kindness (Ps 103) continues to abundantly bless me with his love, grace and mercy! I am also thankful to Fr. Russell, Fr. Giuseppe, and Julia for their continued assistance and support in helping me carry out my pastoral ministry at the parish.

I am especially thankful to you, dear parishioners of SLM, for showering me with your unconditional warmth, love, kindness and prayers. I offer a heartfelt "Thank you!" Please be assured that all the people of SLM are in my daily prayers and that I bring all your intentions - whether spoken or unspoken - with me every time I go to the altar and celebrate the Holy Eucharist of the Lord!

As many of you know, the central theme for this past year centered on our parish's "Sacred Journey - Restoring the House of God" campaign. When I first started our capital campaign last September, I honestly did not have any expectation on how it would unfold. My disposition and belief have been to "Surrender to God and He will do all things for you!" (Tuesday, 2nd week antiphon of the Breviary). I thought that two-years would be sufficient time for us to raise the three hundred thousand dollars needed to pay for the renovation of the bell towers. The Lord has truly inspired many people to give generously towards the project. In only ten short months, the parish capital campaign has collected \$297,789. This outcome has been nothing short of spectacular, especially when we consider that the majority of our parish base consists of hard working class families, who are struggling to survive in these hard and uncertain economic times. May the Lord bless your generosity!

With the renovation of the bell towers set to finish by the end of July, my attention turns towards our church's aged heating and air-conditioning systems. Both systems are fast approaching their life expectancies, with two of our three chillers used to cool the church, for example, currently non-operational and unserviceable. What is more problematic, however, is how our current systems fails to provide the desired level of comfort one expects from them. Our church tends to either be very cold during the winter months, or extremely hot and uncomfortable during the summer months, despite the heating and cooling systems operating at full capacity. I have hired an engineering firm to help assess our current situation and provide us with different possible solutions. The finer details of the second phase of our restoration campaign will be presented to you in the future.

The restoration of the "House of God" cannot be limited only to the physical structure – the place where we spend our time in praising and worshiping the Lord. It also involves trying to get the people of God become more actively engaged in their faith through their participation in various parish events. It has been truly amazing to see so many people from all ages attending the different Sacred Journey Fundraising Events that the parish set up this past year. These include, for example, the Christmas Market, St. Valentine's Day Family Dance Party, The Cross of Christ Concert, and the Parish Summer BBQ. We have much more events planned for the coming months so please stay tuned for additional details.....

One last thought.... In Fahad's reflection published last weekend, he wrote, "I encourage anyone, Catholic or not, to attend RCIA classes. While reading books can provide education, there is nothing like learning directly from a teacher in a community setting. It will not only deepen your understanding of Christianity, but it will also help you grow as a better Christian, a better Catholic, and a better human being" (See Bulletin for Corpus Christi, 2025). Fahad's exhortation is on mark! Experience shows that too many Catholics, especially those who were baptized as babies or infants, unfortunately have a very poor grasp of the doctrines and teachings of the Church. Consequently, many end up living weak and tepid spiritual lives. In my last pastoral assignment at Our Lady of the Airways, I gave the parishioners there an adult faith formation program that lasted a few months. The program was distinct from the RCIA (Rite of Catholic Initiation for Adults) and offered to any adult Catholic who wanted to learn more about his/her faith. I will be offering a similar program to the parishioners of SLM starting this coming October. More details will come in the Fall with regard to dates and topics....

With summer finally upon us, let me conclude by giving you the blessing that the Lord bestowed upon his Chosen People: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace" (Num. 6:23-26).






