Dear Friends in Christ, Thank you for supporting our BELL TOWER FUND. Within only a few short months, we successfully reached our goal of raising \$300,000 and completed the repairs of our bell tower. Now we can rest assured that our church bell tower foundation can last another 65 years, hopefully more!

As we mentioned at the beginning of our Campaign, part two will consist of replacing our 20-year-old parish heating and cooling systems. Since my arrival in July 2022, both systems have broken down on a number of occasions, with the repair costs being quite substantial as a result. In 2024, for example, the parish spent more than \$50,000 to replace some aging and leaking valves. The manufacturer told us that although the systems might be able to provide a few additional years of service, we should nevertheless expect future problems to occur. Moreover, they informed us that our parish would most likely have to incur additional costs in order to maintain the system, as the technology continue to improve on newer systems.

We began a 2-year pledged donation program and we are continuing with it for part two of our Campaign. I am grateful to all those who signed up for this program that continues to support the needs of the Campaign. If you are interested in signing up to support our church and for the convenience it provides, please send an email to slmparishfund2024@gmail.com. Dividing an amount by 12-24 months makes for easier payment of larger gifts.

A few days ago, I received the much-anticipated proposal on how to upgrade our systems from our engineering consulting firm. They estimated that the cost of the project would be approximately \$700,000. I have forwarded the proposal to each member of our parish Finance Committee and to a handful of parishioners, who have a great deal of expertise and knowledge in the heating and cooling industry. I am looking forward in hearing their inputs, feedback, concerns, etc. Be assured that I will take everything they offer into consideration before making a final decision on how to proceed with the project.

Once the details are finalized, I will provide you with an update. Meanwhile, I encourage you to continue to support our SACRED JOURNEY CAMPAIGN. The target for our CLIMATE CONTROL FUND is set at \$700,000. While this number is certainly a larger goal to raise, these funds will undoubtedly help ensure that St. Lawrence Martyr continues to be a vibrant place for worship and community fellowship for years to come. Please note that ALL your donations, that is, 100% of it are directed to the Campaign. No administration expenses are incurred because the campaign is run by our wonderful volunteers under my direction, except for software and banking fees.

You can continue to make a donation: Online through our website; Parish Campaign envelopes; By submitting to the parish office a completed donation form downloaded from parish website, or picked-up from fover; Square POS (Point of Sale) terminal for donations with a credit card or interact at parish office. * Please make sure to enclose your completed donation form in a sealed envelope to protect your personal/ financial information. * If you choose to donate via the debit option, please make sure to include a void cheque.

Although my hope is that you won't, nevertheless, you can cancel your donation or pledge at any time, no questions asked. Just complete the Change Form available on the website and send it to the parish office. A consolidated (Sacred Journey, offertory, special projects, etc.) official charitable tax receipt will be sent to you following the end of each year. Luke 16:1-13

You cannot serve both God and mammon.



This parable can be deeply disquieting if we take it as an allegory, that is, if every element in the story is meant (as in Matthew's Parable of the Wheat and the Tares) to have an equivalent in reality. We can't have God praising the steward for his frauds! No, the point of the story is simply the steward's energy and inventiveness, his shrewdness as a 'child of this age'. A lot more thought goes into how to make money than into how to spend it to the best advantage of others! The danger and encumbrance of wealth is such that

inventiveness and energy is needed in using it to win friends in heaven. The full cleverness of the story is more subtle: Jews were forbidden to lend to Jews at interest. The steward cuts off the interest from the bills of his master's debtors, for oil was commonly lent at 100% interest, and wheat at 25%. It was easy to return olive oil adulterated with cheap sesame oil, but if I scatter handfuls of chaff in the grain 1 give you back, you will spot it immediately. So the steward makes his master obey the Law! The sayings added at the end hit the nail on the head: no slave can serve two masters, God and money.

Perciò Gesù ci rimprovera di essere più pronti a salvarci dai mali mondani che dal male eterno, lui che da parte sua ha fatto di tutto perché fossimo salvati, fino a salire in croce per noi. Non ci decidiamo a credere che, se non portiamo il nostro peccato davanti a Dio, siamo perduti. Cominciamo le nostre Messe confessando i peccati che abbiamo commessi, ma usciti di chiesa ricominciamo a parlare di quelli altrui.

Un "test" decisivo dell'autenticità della nostra decisione cristiana è proprio l'uso del denaro.

Non è disonesta la ricchezza in sé, né maledizione la ricchezza esteriore. Ma lo è la ricchezza come idolo, innamoramento e progetto, come deformazione interiore del cuore e della mente, che vogliono a tutti i costi essere produttori di potenza e quindi di potere economico.

Occorre decidersi a scegliere: o mammona o Dio; cioè: o essere il signore per signoreggiare o servire il Signore e godere della sua onnipotenza d'amore.

C'è un solo modo di liberarsi dalla schiavitù della ricchezza: farsi "amici" per mezzo di ciò che si ha, cioè con l'impegno della solidale condivisione.



Dear Padre

September 21, 2025

At a recent gathering, a relative questioned my family's continued participation in the Catholic Church because of the sexual abuse cover-up. What is the best way to address this question?

Resist the temptation to argue or make any response that is not respectful. Choose to respond with empathy and understanding; perhaps something like this: "I understand and respect your feelings. Some have made the difficult choice to leave the Church. Others find the choice to remain also difficult.

"As a mature and discerning person, I am not making excuses for behaviors that are inexcusable. I cannot and will not defend behavior that should not be defended. I choose to remain in the Church because I choose to remain in a relationship with Jesus, and that relationship includes my reception of the sacraments of the Church. I value the sacraments even as I remain vigilant about the conduct of those who have been entrusted with celebrating those sacraments. I retain my practice of the sacraments and, at the same time, I retain my responsibility to be alert to abusive behavior. This is not acceptance or approval of what most certainly happened. It is continuing to participate in what is beautiful and wise and true so that, in the company of other believers, I may become more like Christ." •
